The conclusion of the Deliverable 1 of the PHAEDRA II project – “Authorities’ views on the impact of the data protection framework reform on their co-operation in the EU” states that most DPAs anticipate a significant, strong impact from the passing of the GDPR in general, and particularly for co-operation between European DPAs. But still language and budgetary barriers remains a key topic of discussion.*
